

## Policy 1010: DGB General Powers and Duties

### PURPOSE

This policy lists the appropriate general powers and duties of the District Governing Board (DGB) pursuant to A.R.S. §15-1444.

### GENERAL POWERS AND DUTIES

Maintain the Provisional Community College District under its jurisdiction for the fiscal year and, if the monies of the district are sufficient, maintain the Provisional Community College District for a longer period.

Adopt policies in a public forum to offer programs that meet the educational needs of the population served by the Provisional Community College District.

Enforce the courses of study prescribed by the DGB.

Visit the campus under its jurisdiction and examine carefully its management conditions and needs.

Exclude from the Provisional Community College District all books, publications or papers of a sectarian, partisan or denominational character intended for use as textbooks.

Appoint and employ a chancellor or chancellors, vice chancellors, a CEO or presidents, Chief Finance Officer (CFO), vice presidents, deans, professors, instructors, lecturers, fellows, and such other officers and employees it deems necessary. The DGB may enter into employment contracts with chancellors, vice chancellors, CEOs, and CFOs for a duration of one (1) to three (3) years.

Determine the salaries of persons it appoints and employs. A district may not compensate an employee for work performed on behalf of an elected employee representative organization and may not provide more favorable terms and conditions of employment to any employee because that individual belongs to an elected employee representative organization.

Remove any officer or employee if in its judgment the interests of education in this state require the removal.

When the Provisional District becomes a fully accredited District, award degrees, certificates, and diplomas on the completion of courses and curricula as it deems appropriate.

Appoint or employ, if it deems necessary, public safety officers who shall have the authority and power of peace officers. The police officers who have received a certificate from the Arizona peace officer standards and training board are eligible for membership in and benefits under either A.R.S. §38-5.2 or the public safety personnel retirement system under A.R.S. §38-5.4.

Determine the location within the district the location of the Provisional Community College District campus and authorize the purchase, receive, hold, make and take leases of, sell, and convey real or personal property for the benefit of the Provisional Community College Districts under its jurisdiction.

Obtain insurance or be self-insured, or a combination of insurance and self-insurance, against loss, to the extent it is determined necessary on Provisional Community College District building(s) of the district. The local district shall have an insurable interest in the buildings.

The District Governing Board may fulfill any other powers and duties as deemed appropriate and/or necessary to a particular District situation or environment.
